







Age Well Fund - Guidelines and Criteria

Purpose

The purpose of the Age Well fund is to address the priority outcome:

For people to live as safely and independently as possible as they grow older

The funding can be used to:

- Improve levels of physical activity in older adults >65
- Improve outcomes for carers particularly considering respite care and/or advocacy
- Cost of living –specifically support for vulnerable older adults to deal with practicalities
- Improved mental health for older adults >65

Criteria

All applications must be able to demonstrate that they will support and offer a solution that reflects and contributes to the overarching Age Well campaign, long-term plan outcomes and priority areas listed above.

Encourage partnership working

Projects will need to demonstrate an exit strategy

Funds can be used for capital and/or revenue

Fund Value

Total funding available is £127,000 for Tendring and £122,00 for Colchester, but could be more depending on domain linkage

Applications

- Grants starting from £5,000 up to £50,000
- Larger Grants will be considered but would encourage a partnership approach.
- All funding will be allocated by November 2023 and all funds distributed by March 2024
- Projects will run for two years from funding allocation date

Who Can Apply

The grant fund invites applications from not-for-profit organisations and public sector partnerships such as:

- Registered voluntary and charitable organisations (including Local Delivery groups of schools with charitable status)
- · Community groups
- Tenants and residents' groups
- · District, parish, town councils and Local Authority
- NHS organisations
- · Faith groups
- Housing associations (not for profit only)
- Most sports organisations (voluntary and charity only)
- Private clubs (voluntary and charity only)
- Most co-operatives and social enterprises (provided profits are retained for the benefit of the members or community served)
- Community interest companies
- Not for profit trade associations
- Partnerships of community focussed organisations

Target Groups

Colchester and Tendring residents aged 65 and over

Conditions

- Partnership bids are preferred
- If not working in partnership you will need to demonstrate how you will work with/signpost to other organisations
- Be open to cross cutting themes
- All applications will need to complete EqIA Equality Impact Assessment section on application form
- All applications will need to demonstrate value for money

16th January 2023 – Funding Launch 17th February 2023 – Closing date for funding March 2023 – Awards announced.
