We are pleased that Matt and Leila have joined C360. Matthew provides an introduction to his work and role. He has completed his initial 10-week internship and we have now extended this. Leila Harrison joined us as an Engagement Officer in September and has a keen interest in building further links with families and schools.

Welcome Matthew Mason! - A few words from our intern...

Hi, my name is Matt, and I am now working on the Heart of Greenstead project! Being about to go on to do my MA in Politics, I am doing a focused piece of work looking at student engagement in the area, filling in a significant engagement gap for this demographic.

The student experience is very important to me, so I have been speaking to students to understand their needs, living conditions and social interactions, thereby allowing us to represent them effectively within the project.

During my research, I have observed a divide between residents and students that make them feel excluded within the community and that students are either not aware of or do not want to use services available outside of campus.

As such, going forward with the HoG project, I will be looking to give power to the student voice, securing the satisfaction of their individual needs, whilst concurrently fostering a sense of community between the residential and student population.

By achieving the tasks outlined, I believe that we can build a better and more engaged community within Greenstead!

Community Voices—in the course of engagement for the Heart of Greenstead programme, C360 have been hearing from local people and want to share some quotes that demonstrate what they care about and how they view the area....

I have lived in Greenstead all my life; I am content here. There is a loyal community spirit. I do not like the trouble that happens on the estate, it is the teenagers. There is nothing for them to do, the focus is all on little kids and the elderly not the bigger kids. I see housing development but the area itself is never improved. The roads are terrible, the potholes make driving dangerous. No one bothers with Greenstead. It will always be the same. I work here but live out of area. I see a constant pattern of the same kind of people going round and round in circles. They do not get the right treatment they need for mental health and get stuck in a cycle of unemployment and benefits. It ripples through the community. It would be good if we could create local jobs. Greenstead looks run down. You never see police.

There needs to be more things for adults to do. I felt lonely during lock down. There are only clubs if you are little or old. There should be more support for mental health. There needs to be more shops, a bakery would be nice and more choice. I don't like the Co-op I go to Tesco. My kids are at school now and it would be nice to meet other mums in my situation.

I like the community centre, I stay in Greenstead I do not go out in town. The area needs cleaning up, there is litter and rubbish everywhere. People do not care around here about anything. It has changed and it is not for the better. The shopping centre looks run down, the kids hanging around make me uncomfortable, but they are just bored.

I have lived in Greenstead for ... [many] years and raised my children here. It is not what people expect it to be. There is a good community spirit, basic shops, and a barber. I would like to see more social groups for adults and for young lads. There is a lot of gangs of kids, nothing for them to do. Maybe there could be some outside space groups. It would be good if the council planted fruit trees around Greenstead so families with financial issues and their kids could pick fresh fruit. I would like to see more varied community events. My son does night work and I worry about him walking home in the small hours.

Life Stories Library

We are committed to ensuring that a range of experiences and voices are heard and involved in the processes linked to the engagement plan. Development of the life stories library has been a key priority to provide more detailed information about people's lives and circumstances, to better shape understanding as the project moves towards implementation. We have captured our first two stories and will be adding to the library over the coming weeks.

Community360 working with Healthwatch Essex

Since 2020, Community360 and Healthwatch Essex have been supported by the Health and Wellbeing Alliance to explore the role voluntary and community groups can play in improving the health and wellbeing of local people. They have formed a series of asset reports. Each report includes case studies and citizen's voices from across Colchester and Tendring. The next report will be researching topics linked to managing long term health conditions and assist the Stay

Well domain group within the Alliance. Greenstead is a chosen area for engagement and capturing lived experience. The Active Wellbeing Society (TAWS)—Share Shacks

The Active Wellbeing Society will be working in Greenstead supporting the Essex Pedal Power project. Part of their work includes developing shared activities and they are seeking feedback from local people about the potential of operating a Share Shack in the area.



Share Shacks are spaces to share, learn, create and grow. A space to connect with each other by borrowing, repairing, re-using and being creative – a place to celebrate what's already in communities with communities.

Share Shacks are commonly known as 'Library of Things' where, instead of just borrowing books, you can borrow anything from cricket sets to carpet cleaners, saucepans to sewing machines. More than this, they also create space for the sharing of skills and resources, whether that's learning about mending clothes,

woodwork, repairing electrical items or writing poetry – it can be anything. Share Shacks run on a pay-as-you-feel basis where people can donate money, items or time by leading skill sharing sessions for example – everyone has complete discretion over the transaction and it doesn't create a barrier to those who are unable to offer something in return.

Embedded in communities, Share Shacks can help provide a holistic wraparound model of support, whilst creating a sustainable local economy system by eliminating waste and promoting the continual use of resources.
