#### Liveable Neighbourhoods Workshop. Monday 5th December.

Members of Essex County Council, Colchester City Council and C360 met at Colchester Town Hall to discuss the Town Deal's Liveable Neighbourhood project. The aim is to deliver sustainable "safer,

greener & healthier" travel by walking, cycling, wheeling and public transport. The desire is a future road network that is safer and encouraging of residents to cycle and use other means of travel. New walking and cycle paths can be created as part of the project. Residents can access free adult and family cycling training, including information on park & ride services and discount on bus fair. Also discussed was the theme of green spaces and how these untapped natural spaces can be utilised to create community gardens, allotments and places that will bring activity and joy into the entire neighbourhood. It was also considered how we can gain the interest of young people into community activity and nature.





## Christmas Fair at Greenstead Community Centre, on Saturday 26th November.

The community centre was festively decorated by community centre manager Nicola Davey. The main hall was lined with stalls featuring Christmas ornaments and other decorative, home made arts and crafts for sale. C360's table offered a raffle, guess how many sweets in the jar and guess the name of the bear, which was available for one lucky child. The bear's name was Ludwig!

Father Christmas arrived to entertain and gift local children. Mayor of Colchester Cllr. Tim Young, and Cllr. Julie Young made an appearance with Santa. The staff at Kelly's Kafé were busy serving food and refreshment's. The fun family event was visited by many, with the Community Centre raffle raising over £400 for local projects!



#### Out and about in Greenstead:

- Conversation being had with local people have been focused around the chemist situated in Tamarisk way. There is a general feeling of being unsatisfied with the service as people are left waiting for extended periods to collect their prescription and when the medication is dispensed it is being done so in separate parts, this is not ideal to many people. There is also complaint about having to wait outside the front of the medical facility for long periods especially to those with physical health and anxiety issues. Data being collected from the surveys will be collated.




### A Community-Led Workshop
