# About the fund

The purpose of the North East Essex Hyperlocal Fund is to support non-profit groups based in local communities to build resilient local Neighbourhoods that help to improve health and wellbeing for residents.

The Hyperlocal Fund addresses the following local priorities:

- Reduce the burden of deprivation and inequalities
- Tackle isolation and loneliness
- Improve mental health and reduce suicide
- Improve physical health and the management of long-term conditions which affect local residents
- Increase physical activity to reduce obesity

Community360 administered the fund for the city of Colchester for One Colchester granting funding of

# £252,018

matched with £19,845.50 from the Age Well domain and £10,994.45 from the Feel Well domain



40% of organisations had not applied for funding before. The Fund encouraged new and grassroots community organisations to get in touch.



**25** organisations supported to deliver in local **Neighbourhoods** 

> **13** organisations received funding for Colchester North, Central and South (cross border projects)

**4** applicants were ineligible for the fund, but Community360 has helped signpost them to other funding streams or access or support in different ways.

**28%** of funding went to diverse groups

# About the process

The Hyperlocal fund was launched in June 2023 and supported by a panel of public and voluntary sector representatives from the Neighbourhoods programme working across Colchester. Operated as a rolling application process, grants were submitted through an online form and assessed periodically
